Engineering is one of the most popular professions in Classic because it is widely regarded as the best in many PvP and PvE dungeon/raid situations, as well as for twinks. It is also the only profession in the game to offer companion pets. Paladins, lacking ranged attacks, can also use some bombs for ranged damage when needed. Springspindle Fizzlegear in Tinker Town of Ironforge Springspindle Fizzlegear Roxxik in Nogg's Machine Shop of Orgrimmar Roxxik Buzzek Bracketswing in Gadgetzan, Tanaris Buzzek Bracketswing Buzzek Bracketswing is the only Engineer who you can learn Artisan Engineering from. Let's go into a little bit more detail about Mr. Bracketswing's importance. Buzzek Bracketswing is a very notable Engineering trainer, located in Gadgetzan, Tanaris. He can train every rank of Engineering: Apprentice, Journeyman, Expert and Artisan. It is with him that you can advance your skill from 225 to 300. Here are the schematics you'll learn from him: Find an anvil - you must be within vicinity of one to craft most items. Have all of the crafting materials and tools in your bags, not in your bank. Open your spellbook ('P' is the default keybind). Look for the icon & click on it. Your Engineering skill is now opened. Select a recipe to view how to create. Select 'Create' once you have all of your materials. Engineering primarily requires metal bars, mined as ore and then Smelted into bars by Miners. However, some recipes also require herbs, cloth, or leather. Many Engineering schematics also require you to craft components like screws or tubes, which are then used in more-advanced schematics. For example, requires Handful of Copper Bolts, which in turn are also crafted from Engineering. While some professions allow you to simply create items without additional fuss, for Engineers you must have certain combinations of tools in your bags. Visiting any of these items in our database, and clicking on the "Tools" tab, will show you what items require them. The following leveling guide is primarily focused on the cost of purchasing materials, as opposed to gathering them with Mining. For example, the cost of Coarse Stone is usually higher than the cost of Silver Bar (depending on your server) - however, while leveling Mining you will certainly have a surplus of Coarse Stone. Engineering is one of the more difficult professions to level up efficiently, as there can be several deviations from this guide and frustrating skill level gaps (for example, around 175 to 200). In conjunction with this guide for Engineering is also a viable alternative, with more detailed leveling options. As with all professions in World of Warcraft, the player gains skill points when performing a specific task (crafting an item, gathering a node, skinning a beast, etc). The frequency at which the player earns these skill points is relative to their current skill level. This is denoted by four color codes:Orange - Always grants a skill pointYellow - Frequently grants a skill pointGreen - Infrequently grants a skill pointGray - Does not grant a skill pointEach rank of Engineering can be learned at the following skill levels and character levels: Below is an approximate list of materials you will need leveling Engineering from 1-300. These have been calculated for a high confidence level, but the actual amount may vary due to one's luck with gaining skill points. Yellow and especially green-level skill point. Crafted Ingredients: Follow the directions in the leveling guide and you'll be making these items for skill as you go along. There is no need to purchase these separately; the materials needed to create these are already included in the shopping list above. Once players have reached an Engineering skill of 200 and a character level of 30, they can choose to specialize in either Gnomish Engineering or Goblin Engineering. Keep in mind that choosing a specialization is optional. Both specialization scan create powerful items that are applicable in both PvE and PvP. Gnomish Engineering provides more equipment, whereas Goblin Engineering provides more consumables. Gnomish Engineering Questline Upon reaching level 30 and reaching 200 Engineering skill, players can pick up the guest Gnome Engineering from multiple Engineering trainers, which will lead them to either Tinkmaster Overspark in Ironforge (for Alliance players), or Oglethorpe Obnoticus in Stranglethorn Vale's Booty Bay (for Horde players). Completing the Show Your Work quest will reward the player with the Gnomish Engineering specialization, as well as the Gnome Engineer Membership Card. This membership card will allow you to learn the schematics that are only available from the Gnomish Engineering Trainer, and the card lasts for 14 days of in-game time (336 hours). The membership card can be renewed through the quest Membership Card Renewal / Membership Card Renewal, which costs . In addition to completing the Gnome Engineer's Renewal Gift. This renewal gift item can contain several Engineering items and crafting materials, as well as unique schematics such as Schematics Lil' Smoky, Gnomish Engineering Trainers There are two Gnomish Engineering Schematics Such as Schematics S DPS. Gnomish Battle Chicken is a Bind on Pickup Trinket that summons a Pet. After being summoned, the Battle Chicken will attack the nearest target and has a chance on hit to trigger a Battle shout, Battle Squawk, which increases the Melee Attack Speed by all party members by 5%. Also in PvE, you will be able to use Dense Dynamite, a bomb that deals ~400 damage, which only has a cooldown of 60 seconds, which can be a significant boost in damage. The Arcanite Dragonling is another useful trinket. It attacks the nearest target, stacking Flame Buffet for increased fire damage taken, which is excellent against any enemy vulnerable to fire. As usual with Engineering, many of these items have powerful effects, but are prone to malfunctioning and backfiring on you. Goblin Sapper Charge is an absolute monster in world PvP and group battles, allowing a team to completely decimate the other if they time their Sappers. It's also extremely important in every PvP scenario to have Dense Dynamite and Iron Grenade in your bags. Goblin Rocket Helmet is a helmet item that will enable you to charge a target and "knocking them silly." which is an incapacitate effect that lasts for over 10 seconds. This can be a great tool to close the distance, as well as a great way to keep a target Crowd Controlled for a more extended period. Schematics that are only available through Goblin Engineering can be found below. If you're not happy with your specialty, or would like to change it, there is a way to do so in WoW Classic. You do, however, have to re-learn your profession. Here's how to do it:1. Unlearn Engineering entirelyPress 'K', by default, to open up your skill menu. Scroll to find your current profession. Click on it. Look for the red circle with a slash through it, next to the profession to unlearn.2. Level Engineering, starting from scratch, and get back up to at least 200.3. Travel to Steamwheedle Port in Tanaris and search for the gnome, Narain Soothfancy, located inside a hut:Narain Soothfancy4. Inside the hut where he is located, you'll find Book "Evil Soothsaying for Dummies", that you can hover your cursor over and right-click on: This book allows you to change specializations that you've previously learned with your profession. There is currently no quest or fee involved in doing so! Below is a comprehensive list of items that can be created with Engineering, and where they can be learned/obtained. Engineers can craft many types of ammunition for Hunters, including Thorium Shells which is the best ammunition in the game. This can be converted into Thorium Headed Arrow via Arrows Are For Sissies. Biznicks 247x128 Accurascope is also the best ranged enchant, also crafted by Engineers. Many Engineering devices and trinkets have powerful effects, but they can backfire on you on rare occasion! Explosives are a good way to increase your DPS in PvE and PvP situations, as well as AoE utility like stunning nearby mobs or generating threat. Unlike other professions, most gear crafted by Engineers also requires you to be an Engineer to equip it. Many crafted Engineering items are goggles. Besides looking cool for RP, these have powerful stats, such as Green Tinted Goggles which is great for twinks, and Green Lens which is prized by many casters for pre-raid BiS. Another type of crafted Engineering item are weapons, such as Core Marksman Rifle or Force Reactive Disk. The following items are needed to craft more elaborate Engineering items. Engineering isn't all about min-maxing PvE and PvP--you can have fun! Engineers can craft a variety of fireworks, several companion pets, and even toys like Steam Tonk Controller. As you can see, there's a massive amount of Engineering items, we've broken it down for both PvP and PvE. Are you interested in collecting every rare recipe? This section covers some of the best PvP items for Engineers in Classic WoW. (Source) Gnomish Cloaking Device: can be used similarly to an Invisibility Potion; sneak by fights or get the jump on your enemies. SOURCE: Zan Shivsproket in Alterac Mountains (200) Goblin Sapper Charge: one of the MOST important items for large scale PvP. This item, while used in unison with teammates, is capable of wiping out masses of enemies. This is one of the biggest reasons to not stack up too much in large PvP scenarios. SOURCE: Goblin Engineering trainer (205)Gnomish Net-o-Matic Projector: like other CC items, is useful because it is always beneficial to be able to control your enemy's movement. In some match ups, locking down your opponent can heavily favor you in the battle if not ensure the victory. SOURCE: Gnomish Engineering trainer (210)Goblin Rocket Boots: along with any other movement speed item, is great in Warsong Gulch for flag running. Aside from flag running, these boots can also be used by several classes just to kite others easily. SOURCE: Goblin Rocket Helmet: amazing for pvp. It can immediately take one opponent out of a team fight in an instant! This item is a MUST HAVE for any hardcore pyp player. For horde, there is a helmet with a similar effect that does not require Engineering trainer (235)Gnomish Mind Control Cap: not only can you take one of the enemies out of the team fight, but you can make them fight for you for a short period of time! However, you cannot control what abilities the mind controlled person will use. SOURCE: Gnomish Death Ray: is the type of trinket a player will use if they are trying to instantly burst another player down. This trinket ends up costing you some health, but is capable of doing some massive burst damage for just using one trinket slot. Sometimes this trinket can do over 2000 damage! SOURCE: Gnomish Engineering trainer (260) World Enlarger: does not inherently give you more damage, more health, or anything of that nature. All it does is make you smaller. HOWEVER, this minimizing effect stacks with the shrinking of Noggenfogger Elixir making the player incredibly small. Being this small sometimes allow you to sneakily capture a base and not be seen. SOURCE: Gnomish Engineering trainer (250)Thorium Grenade: and other grenades can be thrown from a distance and after a short delay, damage and stun anyone hit. This can be great in 1v1 scenarios or in group battles giving the player yet another tool to interrupt someone while getting a bit of extra damage in. Players can get really creative and even create combos using grenades to chain CC an enemy. SOURCE: Buzzek Bracketswing in Gadgetzan, Tanaris (260)Catseye Ultra Goggles: increases stealth detection, making it great against Rogues and Night Elves. It is the only stealth detection gear in the game, providing 9 points of detection. Catseye Elixir, a temporary consumable provides 10 points. SOURCE: Level ~40 World DropFlash Bomb: makes all beasts flee for 10 seconds--great if you need to get Hunter and Warlock pets off of you. SOURCE: Reward from Pearl DivingMajor Recombobulator: is an item that is great when dueling a mage or against a mage heavy team. Typically it is better to break a Polymorph immediately instead of letting a Polymorph heal you, so that the mage does not have free reign to do as he pleases. SOURCE: Buzzek Bracketswing in Gadgetzan, Tanaris (275)Arcane Bomb; is one of the most expensive explosives an engineer can craft, but also one of the most deadly. In mass scale PvP if you can land this bomb on a group of casters, especially healers, the fight is over almost immediately. The damage that this bomb does is nothing to laugh at, but its true power comes from the silencing effect. 5 seconds is a huge amount of time to be completely taken out of a fight. SOURCE: Buzzek Bracketswing in Gadgetzan, Tanaris (300)Discombobulator Ray: does not do damage or stun. It is not capable of completely turning a team fight into your favor. However, it is great at what it does do, and that is enable you to chase someone down. It slows after activation, but most importantly, this item will automatically make any enemy dismount immediately when hit by the ray. SOURCE: Engineering trainers (160)Gyrofreeze Ice Reflector, Hyper-Radiant Flame Reflector, Ultra-Flash Shadow Reflector: are all trinkets that are based off of prediction, but if predicted well, can completely end a 1 on 1 fight. Any spell reflected with these items are reflected with these items are reflected with full effects. This means that if the enemy uses a damage cool down to burst you, it will turn on them. If a Warlock casts Fear you, they will get feared instead. You get the point. All three of these reflectors are not cheap, but are an essential part of any PvPer]s arsenal. SOURCE: Schematics sold by Xizzer Fizzbolt, dropped by Risen Inquisitor respectively. While Engineering is well known to be the best PvP profession of choice in Classic WoW, it is also extremely powerful in PvE dungeons and raids. Here are some of the best PvE Engineering items: Flame Deflector, items that absorb and reflect Fire Damage, are very helpful in earlier raids such as Molten Core, Blackwing Lair, Onyxia, SOURCE: Dropped by Mekgineer Thermaplugg and Solakar Flamewreath respectively. Goblin Sapper Charge: instant bomb, deals nice AoE damage. Raids stack these together for tough pulls. Tanks also use these for helping maintain threat generation. That being said, most Engineering bombs, grenades, dynamites and more all can contribute to higher DPS/threat in PvE situations. SOURCE: Goblin Engineering trainer (205)Gnomish Battle Chicken and Arcanite Dragonling: will help boost your DPS, especially during boss fights, see Gnomish Engineering section for more details. Several Engineering items are very powerful for level 19 PvP Twinks. Green Tinted Goggles: Before you get your fishing hat, this is going to be your best option for a helm and it requires you to max Engineering. If RNG isn't in your favor, you might be using this for guite some time while you are trying to catch a Keefer's Angelfish. Taught by Engineering Trainers at 150. Minor Recombobulator: This is another item from Engineering that can hold one of your trinket slots while you are working toward your Arena Grand Master. Schematic sold by Fradd Swiftgear in Wetlands and Namdo Bizzfizzle (outside the Gnomeregan dungeon). Big Bronze Bomb: With this, Engineering gives any twink character the ability to stun enemies as well as deal a bit of extra fire damage. This item is extremely useful similar to how useful grenades are for max-level PVP.
